Canadian Adaptive Snowboard Program INTERNATIONAL SUMMIT

WhistlerBlackcomb, Whistler, B.C. Canada March 11-14, 2008

The Canadian Snowboard Federation (CSF) would like to invite everyone interested in developing adaptive snowboarding in Canada and around the world to attend the second annual Canadian Adaptive Snowboard Program (CASP) International Summit. The summit emphasizes the development of athletes, coaches, and provincial, national and international administrators. The CASP Summit will take place at Whistler Blackcomb in Whistler, BC from March 11-15, 2008.

Interested participants include:

- Adaptive Snowboard Athletes;
- Trained snowboard coaches;
- Provincial representatives to build adaptive snowboarding activities and events at the provincial level;
- Experts in the area of snowboarding and/or disabled sports.

The 2008 Canadian Adaptive Snowboard Program (CASP) International Summit has the following three (3) components:

1) Train to Train Adaptive Snowboard Athlete Development Camp

Where: WhistlerBlackcomb Mountain, BC

When: Tuesday, March 11 (8:30am) - Wednesday, March 12, 2008 (4pm) What: Focus on technical training (on and off snow) & competition preparation

- Discipline specialization (Snowboardcross training);
 - Core strength & injury prevention;
 - High volume, low intensity workloads.

<u>Who:</u> Adaptive Snowboarding athletes planning on competing at the WSF Adaptive Snowboard World Cup (athletes competing in the World Cup are recommended to participate in the training camp).







<u>Who:</u> Trained adaptive snowboarding coaches are welcome to shadow the Train to Train athlete development camp.

2) WSF Adaptive Snowboard World Cup

Where: Blackcomb Mountain, Whistler, BC

<u>When:</u> Friday, March 14, 2008 (See *Race Notice* below for details) <u>What:</u> Single person snowboardcross race with inspection, training and 2 time trial runs. Prizes will be awarded to the top three women and men competitors. <u>Who:</u> Adaptive Snowboarding athletes from Canada and from around the world interested in competing at a high performance level.

3) The CASP International Sport Building Workshop

Where: Whistler, BC

When: Saturday, March 15, 2008 (8:30am-5pm; followed by a networking dinner) What: The CASP International Sport Building Workshop will include a full day information workshop to discuss the development of the sport and establish a network of expert resources. The Workshop will address the following topics:

- Classification;
- Long Term Athlete Development;
- Awareness and recruitment of athletes;
- Event hosting at a regional, national and international level;
- Development at the club level (integrating able-body snowboard clubs to provide training opportunities to adaptive athletes).

<u>Who:</u> Adaptive snowboard athlete representatives, adaptive snow sport coaches, classifiers, provincial and club representatives, and any other experts in the area of disabled sport and/or snowboarding.
