**Snow Sports NZ 2011 WSF Para- Snowboard World Cup as part of Winter Games NZ.
Lake Wanaka, New Zealand: August 2011**

We are excited to welcome riders from around the world to the 100% Pure New Zealand Winter Games and the 2011 WSF Para-Snowboard World Cup Event which are held from the 16 - 18 August 2011 at Cardrona Alpine Resort in Lake Wanaka, New Zealand.

The event will feature two Para-Snowboard cross competitions;- a Nations Cup 17th August 2011 and one Para-Snowboard cross World Cup 18th August 2011, both at Cardrona Alpine Resort.

The Nations Cup is being hosted by Cardrona Alpine Resort and Snow Sports NZ, with the 2011 WSF Para-Snowboard World Cup Event hosted as part of Winter Games NZ with Snow Sports NZ. This pre-information will be succeeded with a full information event pack in the near future.

The dates of 100% Pure New Zealand Winter Games is from 13 - 28 August 2011.

WSF Para-Snowboard World Cup Event Fee – No charge

WSF Para-Snowboard World Cup Accommodation Package at Oakridge Resort for duration of World Cup. Details to follow.

Nations Cup – Event fee \$120 includes lift pass, race fee and membership to SSNZ for adaptive athletes. 2011 International membership to Adaptive Snow Sports NZ allows purchase of day lift tickets for half price at all commercial snowsports resorts in NZ for athletes with a disability.

Entry and registration

Entries will be accepted in accordance with the WSF rules for the World Cup.

Entries details will be given in the full pack.

WSF Para-Snowboard Race License All riders will be required to have an active WSF Para-Snowboard Race License before they will be eligible to compete. All of the information on Race Licenses is available on the WSF [website here](#): As this event technically falls under the 2011/2012 season, riders will be required to re-active their Race License for the next season.

Official accommodation for the World Cup is at [Oakridge Resort](#). World Cup IPC Snowboarders that have entered the event that want to stay at Oakridge will organise this with Winter Games NZ directly. This is subsidised for the world cup 65 Euro each night for dinner bed and breakfast on a twin share basis for the nights of August 15th to 19th inclusive.

If you want to stay additional nights/meals you will need to organise this directly with Lottie at Oakridge Reservations.

We recommend you get onto accommodation as soon as you can as it is limited and filling fast.

Medical Information If you are injured in New Zealand, (including while competing in a ski race), you may need the assistance of the Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC), New Zealand's accident compensation scheme. ACC helps pay for your medical care – and that means paying towards the cost of your treatment and helping your recovery while you remain in New Zealand. ACC will not cover any medical or related costs arising from the accident after you leave New Zealand.
